Topic: Bloom's Taxonomy

Ms. Saritha explained about Bloom's Taxonomy as a framework for categorizing educational learning objectives. She reminded the audience of Benjamin Bloom, the creator of Bloom's taxonomy who designed it in 1956 and Lorrin Anderson who revised it in 2001. She added that Bloom's taxonomy organizes learning outcomes into three domains: cognitive (knowledge-based), affective (emotion-based), and psychomotor (action-based). She concluded that this taxonomy helps teachers set clear, progressive goals for students, enhancing the depth and effectiveness of the learning process and demonstrated some examples of CO's, PO's, PSO's and their mapping and setting of the question paper following the above mapping.
